There's a motion to accept and place on file. Any discussion? Seeing none. All those in favor?

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

All those opposed? Motion passes. All right. Communications. Since our last meeting, we've received four advisories from Comcast. I believe everyone received copies of those by email and they'll be entered into the record. Any questions, comments? Seeing none, is there a motion? We accept and place on file. Jennifer McCormack.

Jennifer McCormack:

Jennifer McCormack, move to accept and place on file.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

There's a motion to accept and place on file. Any discussion? All those in favor?

All:

Aye.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

All those opposed? Motion passes. All right, Mr. Poehnert.

Jeff Poehnert, PEG Program Manager:

Thank you. Jeff Poehnert, PEG Manager. Our current balance of the operating account 2505 is \$154,029.18. Our expenses for February were \$30,680. Our operations we had 5,333 Cablecast totals from December '24 to February 2025. And of this 182 Live Events, Public 96 had 21, Education, 99 had 61, Government 16 had 54, and our High-Definition Channel had 46.

We had 5,700 playbacks. And of this we had Public 96 had 2,593, Education 99 had 929, and Government 16 had 839 and our HD channel had 1,339. CTAB Subcommittee. The CTAB Budget Subcommittee met on February 24th. After a lengthy discussion, a motion to recommend that 3% of the franchise fee be allocated to Nashua Community Television was unanimously adopted. The discussion further centered around requesting the amount to increase to the full 4% in fiscal year 2027 but no

further motion resulted in this conversation.

As was presented at our special CTAB meeting in November, BRBTV has requested a two-year extension as authorized in their contract. And I did include that paragraph in the contract that shows that BRBTV can extend the contract for two years. And we at Nashua Community Media, endorsed their request and look forward to continue working with them.

In-field wireless equipment upgrade. When we are producing meetings, sporting events, or other city events remotely, one common challenge we face is that internet ports at various locations are often not ideally positioned for our camera placement, depending on the meeting or the event. The result is a myriad of cables across the ground floor as well as a prolonged setup time.

We have been searching for a solution for some time, and a product has finally come to market that exactly fits our needs as well as our pocketbook. The Cosmo C2 is a new wireless video transmission system that enables two cameras to transmit video and audio from each camera back to a single base unit with a range of up to 3,000 feet. The receiver then transmits the audio and video over the internet to either an on-the-site switcher right there, or any of our control room switchers, at various locations within the city.

The Cosmo C2 will allow us to increase our production flexibility and efficiency across the city. And we ask for your approval of an amount not to exceed \$1,500. And the funds for this will be drawn from our 22.2505, 81100 Capital Improvements account.

Pete Johnson, Education Channel Access Administrator:

We'll go to the Educational Programming. I don't want to go through the entire list there, but, we have the last three months' worth of, special programming that the Education Channel did during December, January and February. A lot of it was obviously sports programming, especially starting around the beginning of the winter sports calendar. And also, right after Christmas holiday, there's always tournaments that are held by the Nashua School District. So, we did those. Continue to record IN Education programs as well as, Nashua Public Health Matters program with the Department of Public Health.

One of the other things that, always happens this time of year is the Biddy Basketball from the Nashua Parks Recreation. And we always look forward to recording the Junior Biddy Championship games for the both the boys and the girls. And those were held in February.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

Mr. Bartis and Mr. Russell.

Bob Bartis:

Thank you. Bob Bartis on behalf of BRBTV. Mr. Poehnert went over our numbers, so I won't repeat those. But you saw our live events, our playbacks, and the number of hours that we've produced for TV viewing. We continue to work with our regular hosts and our regular constituents come in to do their respective shows. We continue to run our slides and our billboards on BRBTV and WSMN.live promoting the free TV use of the studio, as well as free equipment sign-outs, and the ability to watch shows on Roku every week that the shows that are produced are uploaded to Roku and Apple TV. And we continue to operate and monitor our live cameras throughout the city, including the Nashua River cam, Nashua Arts Center, Nashua Senior Center, the Chamber of Commerce cam, Mine

Falls Park, and the West Hollis Street cameras. Our live events continue to include, on Thursdays having Mayor Donchess in for his report. Nashua Fire Rescue Chief Steve Buxton, as well as representatives from the Nashua Police Department, also provide weekly live reports. We continue with and as long with AMR Director, Chris Stawasz.

We continue with our live and special broadcasting including for last quarter we did breakfast with Santa at the Nashua Senior Center, Nashua Coral Society, the Humane Society, the live report for the Chamber, for the State of the City provided by the Mayor. And I think lastly, we continue to participate in the quarterly lunch and learns that the New Hampshire Coalition for Community Media puts on. This past quarter was hosted by, Merrimack Public Television. So, we attended that.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

Thank you. Moving on. Old business. Franchise fee split, increase update. Mr. Miseirvitch, or are you,

Jeff Poehnert, PEG Program Manager:

Jeff Poehnert, PEG Manager. That was in the report I did where I gave the update.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

Yes, but I think there was going to be a motion-

Jeff Poehnert, PEG Program Manager:

Oh, okay.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

... for a recommendation-

Jeff Poehnert, PEG Program Manager:

I can't do that for...

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

... to this committee.

Nick Miseirvitch, IT CIO:

Yes. I move to request the 3% out of the 4% franchise fees for the PEG fund still?

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

Yes.

Nick Miseirvitch, IT CIO:

That's the official title?

Jeff Poehnert, PEG Program Manager:

Yeah, sorry.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

Alright. There's a motion. Discussion? Mr. Miseirvitch.

Nick Miseirvitch, IT CIO:

As Mr. Poehnert pointed out, we, this is the conclusion that the subcommittee has made their recommendations and so, we should proceed with discussing with the administration on making this happen to fully fund this group for FY26.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

Any other members? Chief.

Steve Buxton, Fire Chief:

By making this adjustment on their recommendation, will that fund things at an appropriate level for us to be able to continue to move forward as we have been?

Nick Miseirvitch, IT CIO:

For FY26, yes, we will keep an eye on how things progress throughout the year and make a recommendation for FY27 when the time comes.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

Any other comments, questions, concerns? We will move the question. All those in favor of the motion?

All:

Aye.

Andrew Cernota, Chairman:

All those opposed? Motion passes. Thank you. The next item, I think it's also Mr. Miseirvitch's motion. The NPT, the contract extension.

Nick Miseirvitch, IT CIO:

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Nick Miseirvitch again. I move to accept the proposal for BRBTV to extend their contract for an additional two years at a rate of \$175,000 per year.

 - Option # 1 – Down Wires (prompted to enter zip code)
 - Option # 2 – Pole hits, pole transfers and other non channel related Municipal Issues
 - NEW-**Option #3 - PEG (public, education or government) or Local Access Channels
- **STEP 4 Speak with Rep. and obtain job reference #**

From March 1st 2025 to May 31st, 2025, Channel 6 ran approx. 2845 shows/programs (approx. 2156 hour) of which 382 programs (approx.295 hours) were ‘first run’ or shows that aired for the first time during that time frame on the channel along with multiple Live events/shows.

Progress Overview: March 1st 2025 to May 31st, 2025

Shows/Hosts:

We continued to work with existing hosts and produce shows including but not limited to: United Way, VFW, The Ring-Pro Wrestling, Public Health shows in English, French, Spanish, Portuguese and Swahili; People’s View, Gate City Chronicles, Perspectives, Speaking with the Senator, Frankly Speaking, Empower Hour (Greater Nashua Mental Health), Nashua Strong, Just Jocelyn Wellness From Within, and Poetry Palace.

- ✓ Content/Topics include public access shows on: Politics-local, State and National, Literacy, Education, Reading, Dyslexia, Health and Diet, Cooking, Exercise, Yoga, Pilates, Dance, Music/choral/concerts, Jazz, Polka, Swing, Professional Wrestling, High School sports, auto-racing, surfing, painting, artist interviews, nature hikes, nature-environment and environmental issues, animals, space/planets/eclipse, morning Zen, meditation, Special Olympics, religion, faith based shows, wealth, legacy planning, addiction, small businesses, password games.

Written Complaints from the Public: None received during the reporting period.

Training and Tasks Undertaken and Continuing:

- ✓ BRB TV, LLC has had additional training with the new in studio equipment;
- ✓ Renovations of the studio and the control room have been completed this quarter;
- ✓ NPTV continues to run slide/billboards on BRBTV and WSMN.live promoting FREE TV Time and Free Equipment Sign Outs and the ability to watch shows on Roku;
- ✓ Roku Channel and Apple TV are updated weekly with the new shows taped each week;
- ✓ Continuing to operate and additional cameras such that one can now watch our Live Nashua River from Chamber of Commerce, Nashua Arts Center cams, Nashua Senior Center cam Nashua Public Library camera, Entrance to Mine Falls camera and North and South views of Main Street and West Hollis Street. All cameras are viewable on the website;
- ✓ Live camera was placed within the American Legion building to view the mural being painted on the building at 14 Court Street;
- ✓ Live events regular and re-occurring this quarter include Mayor Jim Donchess weekly on air, County Treasurer David Fredette, AMR Director Chris Stawasz, Live monthly reports from Nashua Fire Chief Steve Buxton, and from representatives of Nashua Police Dept;
- ✓ Live and Special broadcasting events this quarter included coverage of: Nashua Fire Rescue Promotions Ceremony, Nashua Police Cone with a Cop; VFW Loyalty Day; the Memorial Day parade; Ward meetings with the Mayor; United Way functions and Chamber of Commerce events;
- ✓ Bob Bartis participated with Pete Johnson at the NH CCM (NH Coalition for Community Media) quarterly meeting regarding relative issues to Public Access Television.(Hosted by Merrimack Public Television—over 10 cities/town participated).

The IT Division hereby submits the following status report of PEG Program activities from March 2025 to May 2025.

FINANCIAL:

Budget - CTAB Financial Report for the month of June 2025 has been submitted.

Current balance of Operating account (2505) is **\$156,420.07**

Expenses for May 2025, including salaries, facility operations, and partial payment for our new studio cameras totaled **\$52,711.00**

OPERATIONS:

Channel GOV Channel 16, NPTV Channel 6, EDU Channel 22 and NCM HD Channel 1073 Broadcasts

- 5333 cablecasts total March 2025 to May 2025:

- 182 live events (PUB 96 = 21, EDU 99 = 61, GOV 16 = 54, NCM-HD = 46)
- 5700 Playbacks (PUB 96 = 2593, EDU 99 = 929, GOV 16 = 839, NCM-HD = 1339)
- 4810 Hours (PUB 96 = 1933, EDU 99 = 908, GOV 16 = 1021, NCM-HD = 948)

Auditorium Camera Placement/Chamber Camera Repair

The camera that had to be removed in the Auditorium to make room for the mural is being reinstalled at a different location on the wall. Keycode is waiting for delivery of an adaptor and then will complete the work. The city is paying for this move. Also, camera 4 in the Chamber required a port reassignment and is now functioning properly.

Studio Camera Replacement Project Update:

The 2-year project to replace the cameras in the TV studio is ending. Three new Canon CR-N500 4K PTZ cameras, including new cabling and pedestal mounts were delivered and installed in early May. Each camera has a front facing talent monitor and one of the cameras has also been outfitted with a Teleprompter. As part of the project, the 15-year-old compact-fluorescent bulbs in the TV studio lighting was replaced, the makeshift stage was permanently removed and both the studio and control rooms were completely cleaned out to have their floors cleaned and waxed. The equipment in the control room was rewired, the audio mixer was replaced and an area rug was installed to help protect the floor. There are still a few cosmetic things left to complete, but all-in-all we are pleased with the progress to date. We may want to consider getting an additional matching PTZ camera that could be used when needed in the studio for larger events or for field production work.

Purchase Request:

The video editing computers that were purchased for use by Jeff and Pete in 2019 are nearing the end of their 5-year service life. These computers get continuous use almost daily, and we would like to purchase new editing/graphic design systems for Dan, Jeff and Pete. The two current computers would be repurposed to be used as the public editing computers in the lobby. Those computers that are now 10 years old are limiting the program updates for several pieces of software, including current Adobe Suite programs and Vegas Pro Editing software. More recently, the computers have been completely freezing during routine editing tasks forcing hard system reboots. One of the systems has been unable to successfully perform an upgrade to Windows 11. Mid-range editing systems of the type we would need are running close to \$5,000 each. We have been very busy recently, but we hope to bring you a more concrete number in time to provide a NTE price in time for the June meeting. Funds are available from either Equipment Repairs and Maintenance or Capital Improvements.
