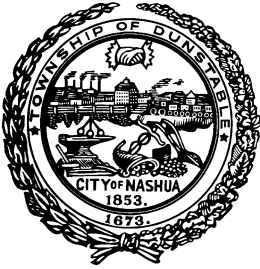

RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua that the following non-binding question be placed on the ballot for the regular municipal election to be held in November 2025:

“The Elm Street Middle School is being redeveloped for new affordable and market rate housing. The Keefe Auditorium is part of the Elm Street Middle School. To enable the Keefe Auditorium to continue to be used for performances, the City must spend approximately \$25 million for a code required heating system, bathrooms and fire protection with no new additional enhancements. Alternatively, the City could allow the Keefe Auditorium to be replaced by more housing and/or by green space. Should the City spend approximately \$25 million to meet code requirements and keep the Keefe Auditorium open?”

ORDINANCE

RULES FOR REMARKS BY ALDERMEN AT MEETINGS

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Twenty-Five

The City of Nashua ordains that Part I “Administrative Legislation”, Chapter 5 “Administration of Government”, Part 2 “Board of Aldermen”, Article III “Rules and Order of Business”, Section 5-14 “Order of business” of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, be amended by adding the new underlined language as follows:

“§ 5-14. Order of business.

...

D. Remarks by Aldermen allowed in Subsections A and B above shall be conducted as follows:

- (1) Speaker may not speak until recognized by the presiding officer;
- (2) One person speaks at a time;
- (3) Each speaker is limited to speaking once per Remarks by Aldermen period and is limited to three minutes during said period;
- (4) Profane and/or obscene remarks are prohibited; and
- (5) The presiding officer has authority to terminate the remarks of any speaker when such remarks do not adhere to this chapter or other applicable law.”

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

This legislation shall take effect following its passage.

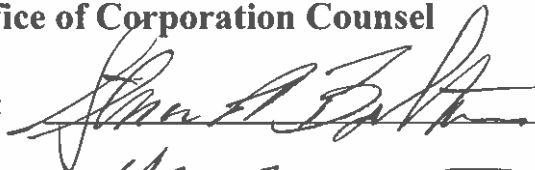

ORDINANCE

INCREASING THE TAX CREDIT FOR A SERVICE-CONNECTED TOTAL DISABILITY

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Twenty-Five

The City of Nashua ordains that Part II “General Legislation”, Chapter 295 “Taxation”, Article VII “Service-Connected Total Disability Tax Credit”, Section 295-15 “Tax credit granted” be amended by deleting the struck-through language and adding the new underlined language as shown:

“§ 295-15. Tax credit granted.

The City of Nashua hereby adopts the provisions of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 72:35, as it may be amended from time to time, relative to a service-connected total disability tax credit. The service-connected total disability tax credit shall be ~~\$2,000~~ \$2,750 credit, which shall replace the standard service-connected total disability tax credit in its entirety and shall not be in addition thereto.”

This legislation shall be effective beginning with the April 1, 2026 tax year.

FISCAL NOTE:

Beginning with the April 1, 2026 tax year, Nashua's Veterans' Tax Credit of \$750 can no longer be combined with Nashua's Service-Connected Total Disability Tax Credit of \$2,000. If this legislation to increase the Service-Connected Total Disability Tax Credit by \$750 passes, the 122 veterans that currently stack those two credits will continue to receive the same total credit amount. However, the 38 veterans who currently receive only the Service-Connected Total Disability Tax Credit will receive an additional \$750 in tax credit, for an estimated additional credit amount of \$28,500.

ANALYSIS

This legislation increases the amount of the service-connected total disability tax credit, from \$2,000 to \$2,750, for the tax year starting April 1, 2026. The increased amount (\$750) is the same amount as the existing Veterans' tax credit that will no longer be allowed to be claimed in addition to the service-connected total disability tax credit.
